1. Explain the following passages with reference to the context:-

(a) If you make it too familiar, it will work no extraordinary effect sickness cometh. I commend rather some diet for certain seasons, than frequent use of physic, except be grown into a custom. For those diets alter the body more, and trouble it less.

OR

That the society is formed in the wisest manner, whose constitution is founded on the nature of man, strikes, in the abstract, every thinking being so forcibly, that it looks like presumption to endeavor to bring forward proofs; though proof must be brought, or the strong hold of prescription will never be forced by reason; yet to urge prescription as an argument to justify the depriving men, (or women) of their natural rights, is one of the absurd Sophions which daily insult common sense.

(b) I cannot see the wit of walking and taking at the same time. When I am the country, I wish to vegetate like the country. I am not criticizing hedgerows and black cattle. I go out of town in order to forget the town and all that is in it. There are those who for this purpose go to watering-places and carry the metropolis with then.

OR

As a single man, I have spent a good deal of my time in nothing down the infirmities of married people, to console myself for those superior pleasures, which they tell.......

(c) We have rocks and mountains and seas and stars and rivers and deserts and fossils of old animals. These and other like things are our books for the earth's early story. Shed the real way to understand this story is not merely to read about it in other peoples books but to go to the great Book of Nature itself.

Is there no other way – there is love it never degenerates – peaceful softening ever widening – the universe is too small for its expansiveness.

(d) The whole nation was excited. India had made its entry into the small group of nations which possessed satellite launch capability. Newspapers carried news of the event in their headlines. Radio and televisions aired special programmers. Parliament greeted the achievement with the thumping of decks.

OR

Faith is defined as confidence or trust in a being, object, living organism, deity, view or in the doctrines or teachings of a religion, as well as confidence based on some degree of warrant. No proof is needed in support of such belief. It should be noted that the word faith is also used as a synonym for hope or for trust.

(e) The relations of the soul to the divine spirit are so pure, that it is profane to seek to interpose helps. It must be that when God speaketh. He should communicate, not one thing, but all things; should fill the world with his voice, should scatter forth of light, nature, time souls, from the centre of the present thought; and hew date and new create the whole.
